"Let's Dialogue, not Debate"

In her blog entry entitled "Let's Dialogue, not Debate," NACSW member Kim Parker suggests that when we dialogue with others about important and controversial issues, we are often taking a

risk - as not everyone is comfortable with being vulnerable and transparent. She shares that even when it comes to connecting with other NACSW members, despite all of us being Christian social workers, we are a diverse group differing in age, ethnicity, work experience, specialty fields, and even socio-political worldviews. As Christians in social work, we each have the ability to show respect, listen empathetically, ask clarifying questions, affirm and validate - and that we can even learn from one another in the process. She reminds us that our goal is not so much to win debates but to increase mutual understanding with dialogue, and that when Christian social workers stay focused on this goal, there's a greater chance that we can affect the rest of the world in a positive, God-glorifying way.
