



Community Collaborations: What are They?


- Two or more groups or organizations working together to address a social problem
- May have formal or informal agreements
- Accountability based on an ongoing honor system, e.g. no hidden agendas, sabotage, control, etc.

Effectiveness of Community Collaborations


- Systemic nature of problems and strategies for alleviating poverty
- Collaborations expand the community investment
- Collaborations offer broader and multiple perspectives and interests
- Shared cost, shared benefit
- Builds interdependence in and for the community
