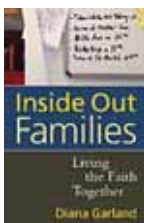

Utilizing the research methods for which she is well known, NACSW Board of Directors member Diana Garland has recently written a book entitled *Inside Out Families: Living the Faith Together*, which guides congregational leaders and counselors to encourage families to engage together in the Christian practice of service. The fruit of family service, Diana writes, is not only a deeper understanding of one another and of what God is doing in the world but also the reordering of a family's values and time together.
